Third Sunday of Lent (22nd/23rd March 2025)

Brothers and sisters,

All three readings on this Third Sunday of Lent speak of God the Father's mercy and compassion, even in disciplining His children, while giving them chances to repent of their sins and renew their lives, despite their repeated unfaithfulness.

The first reading (Ex 3:1-8a, 13-15), tells us how God showed His mercy to His chosen people in Egyptian slavery by giving them Moses as their leader and liberator. The God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob (v 6) revealed Himself to Moses from the burning bush and assured Moses of His Divine presence with His people and of His awareness of their sufferings in Egypt. God declared His intention to use Moses as the leader who would rescue His enslaved people. Then God revealed His name as Yahweh ("I AM Who I AM") and renewed His promise to the patriarchs (v 8), to give them a "land flowing with milk and honey."

In the second reading (1 Cor 10:1-6, 10-12), St. Paul warns us that our merciful God is also a disciplining God. He reminds the Christians of Corinth as he is reminding us today, that they must learn from the sad experience of the unfaithful Israelites in the desert who were punished for their sins by a merciful and just God. The merciful and gracious God is also just and demanding; hence, the Corinthians, and we, must be free from sexual sins and idolatry.

In the Gospel today (Luke 13:1-9), our Lord Jesus Christ tells a parable about the barren fig tree. The owner of the fig tree comes searching for fruits on it over three years but found none, and he threatens to cut it down. However, the gardener begs the owner to give the tree one more year of intensive care and afterwards he can cut it if still bears no fruits. Citing two tragic events, Jesus exhorts the Jews to repent and reform their lives. With the parable of the barren fig tree, Jesus also warns them that the merciful God will not put up with them indefinitely. Although God patiently waits for sinners to repent, giving them grace to do so, He will not wait forever. Time may run out; therefore, timely repentance is necessary. One can say, "A Lent missed is a year lost from the spiritual life."

God expects us to show our repentance and renewal of life, especially during Lent, by producing fruits of love, mercy, forgiveness, and selfless service, instead of remaining like a barren fig tree in Christ's Church.

Sisters and brothers, we never know when we will meet a tragedy of our own sins. Let us turn to Christ, acknowledge our faults and failings, and receive from him mercy, forgiveness and the promise of eternal life. There is no better way to take these words of Jesus to heart than to go to sacramental confession, and there is no better time to go to confession than during Lent. Repentance helps us in life and in death. It helps us to live as forgiven people and helps us to face death without fear.

The Lenten Season invites us to true repentance. The parable in the Gospel today sets out to show that God is giving us time to repent following the intervention of the gardener to allow the fig tree life for one more year.

May we return to God as the Israelites did after four hundred years of their slavery in Egypt. God responded to them through Moses via the theophany of the Burning Bush as we saw in the

First Reading (Exodus 3:1-8a, 13-15). The Burning Bush shows the ever-present (I AM) burning love of God that is waiting for us this Lenten Season.

To repent means to change.


