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Fourth Sunday of Lent (29th/30th March 2025)

Brothers and sisters,

On this fourth Sunday of Lent, the Church encourages us to, "Rejoice and be joyful" because Christ is willing to reconcile us to His Father.

Once, a man became sick. He was told that the only condition to be healed was to forgive and reconcile with those who offended him. So, he wrote to his debtors and enemies, "My dear, having realised the power of forgiveness and reconciliation, I have cancelled all the debts you owe me. Please let us continue to be friends again, and always pray for me!"

This is Providence in action. This man's sickness was God's way of mediating grace to his friends. In the same way, through His death, Christ reassures us that our "debt of sin" has been cancelled. Also, His Sacraments mediate grace for us and reconcile us to God.

In today's second reading, Paul tells us that we are "products of Christ's reconciliation." Christ took the first initiative of reconciling us to God. In other words, owing to sin, we were cut off from God. However, through the sacrifice of Christ, we became God's adopted children. So, we are all children of the same Father through Christ's sacrifice.

It can be disastrous if we continue to dwell in the past. Where the future would lead us is more important than where the past has left us. The story of the prodigal son is one of the most read and reviewed of all the parables of Jesus Christ, and it fits into our humanity because it tells the story of a notorious past and a rebranded future.

In today's Gospel (Luke 15:1-3, 11-32), the story of the prodigal son, reassures us of God's readiness to reconcile with us. It is the story of a loving father and a humble and repentant son. It is the story of reconciliation at its best. Most importantly, it reflects our own daily story and struggle.

A man had two sons, and the younger comes to him asking for his share of his father's inheritance. It is a strange request because his father is still living. However, the father did not argue with him but gives half of what he has. After some time, the young man gathers his properties and travels to a distant country, spending his money with friends and acquaintances. When he came to his senses, he decided to return home regardless of his circumstances. The distant country represents a severe disconnection from the father's house. At a distance, we lose our connection to God's hands and from his attentive ears (Isaiah 59:1-2).

It does not matter how far we have gone away from God or how terrible our past was. What matters is that Christ is willing to reconcile us to His Father and restore our lost glory. He beckons on us, "Come now, let us settle the matter,"..."Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow;" (Isaiah 1:18).

The Lenten season constantly encourages us to seek for reconciliation with God through Christ. Let us make effort to rediscover ourselves, and like the prodigal son, confess and reconcile with ourselves, others and God.

Through the church, Christ has made things easy for us. He has given us the Sacrament of Reconciliation as a means of constantly reconciling ourselves with God.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation helps us in three ways; reconciliation with ourself, our brothers and sisters, and reconciliation with God. One leads to the other. Our reconciliation with God is strongly dependent on our reconciliation with others and, of course, with ourselves.

May we take advantage of this sacrament instituted by Christ to return back to God. This sacrament enables us to, "Taste and see that the Lord is good." (Psalm 34:8)





Bible Reflection—29th March 2025

(Fourth Sunday of Lent)

Tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to listen to Jesus, but the Pharisees and scribes began to complain, saying, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them." Luke 15:1-3

Reflect, today, upon the touching image of these tax collectors and sinners drawing near to Jesus. Though they may have had a certain fear and caution, they would have also had hope. Try to understand what they must have thought and felt as they heard this story of the Father's abundant mercy. Think about how they would have related as they discovered that there was hope for them. too.

If you struggle with being like the scribes and Pharisees, reject that temptation. Instead, see yourself as one of those sinners who drew near to our Lord and you will be the cause of joy in the Heart of the Father in Heaven. Reflection taken from AOB Clergy and Parish Bulleting Vol 23 #5

28th-30th March– Jubilee of the Missionaries of Mercy



During Lent of this Holy Year, I intend to send out Missionaries of Mercy. They will be a sign of the Church's maternal solicitude for the People of God, enabling them to enter the profound richness of this mystery so fundamental to the faith. There will be priests to whom I will grant the authority to pardon even those sins reserved to the Holy See, so that the breadth of their mandate as confessors will be even clearer. They will be, above all, living signs of the Father's readiness to welcome those in search of his pardon. They will be missionaries of

mercy because they will be facilitators of a truly human encounter, a source of liberation, rich with responsibility for overcoming obstacles and taking up the new life of Baptism again. They will be led in their mission by the words of the Apostle: "For God has consigned all men to disobedience, that he may have mercy upon all" (Rom 11:32).

May the message of mercy reach everyone, and may no one be indifferent to the call to experience mercy. I direct this invitation to conversion even more fervently to those whose behaviour distances them from the grace of God. This is the opportune moment to change our lives! This is the time to allow our hearts to be touched! When faced with evil deeds, even in the face of serious crimes, it is the time to listen to the cry of innocent people who are deprived of their property, their dignity, their feelings, and even their very lives. To stick to the way of evil will only leave one deluded and sad. True life is something entirely different. God never tires of reaching out to us. He is always ready to listen, as I am too, along with my brother bishops and priests. All one needs to do is to accept the invitation to conversion and submit oneself to justice during this special time of mercy offered by the Church.

Mercy is not opposed to justice but rather expresses God's way of reaching out to the sinner, offering him a new chance to look at himself, convert, and believe. If God limited himself to only justice, he would cease to be God, and would instead be like human beings who ask merely that the law be respected. But mere justice is not enough. Experience shows that an appeal to justice alone will result in its destruction. This is why God goes beyond justice with his mercy and forgiveness. Yet this does not mean that justice should be devalued or rendered superfluous. On the contrary: anyone who makes a mistake must pay the price. However, this is just the beginning of conversion, not its end, because one begins

to feel the tenderness and mercy of God. God does not deny justice. He rather envelops it and surpasses it with an even greater event in which we experience love as the foundation of true justice.

In this Jubilee Year, may the Church echo the word of God that resounds strong and clear as a message and a sign of pardon, strength, aid, and love. May she never tire of extending mercy, and be ever patient in offering compassion and comfort. May the Church become the voice of every man and woman, and repeat confidently without end: "Be mindful of your mercy, O Lord, and your steadfast love, for they have been from of old" (Ps 25:6). https:// www.vatican.va/content/francesco/en/bulls/documents/papa-francesco_bolla_20150411_misericordiaevultus.html
